

# **Workplace English FAQs**

There are many benefits to offering English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes in the workplace. These include:

- Improved and increased communication among coworkers, with HR, and with managers
- Increased ability to build team community and to work more cohesively
- Improved safety
- Improved productivity and processes due to increased understanding of a shared language
- Increased **efficiency** due to decreased dependence on interpretation
- General investment in employees, resulting in increased employee buy-in
- Added benefit to talent attraction and recruitment processes

# **FAOs**

#### When and for how long are classes held?

Classes are generally offered in sessions of 8 - 15 weeks (minimum of 2 hours per week). Classes can be held before, during, or after employees' work hours, whatever is most convenient for the company and the employees to attend.

#### How much do classes cost?

Costs vary, depending on who the English provider is. Adult Education classes are free to an employer, whereas other options are at a cost. See the options below.

 Can employees who speak different languages participate in the same class session?

Yes. Trained ESOL providers are equipped to teach learners from multiple language groups.

# **Workplace English Options**

#### 1. ADULT EDUCATION PROVIDER

- a. Free to employer
- b. Good for large class sizes and many levels (~25)
- c. Provided in 12-15 week sessions, 4 hrs/wk minimum

### 2. LOCAL PRIVATE LANGUAGE COMPANY

- a. Comes at a cost, minimum ~\$3,900
- b. Best for small class sizes, 6-12 or less, all same level
- c. Provided in 12 week sessions, 2.5 hrs/wk (can vary)

#### 3. IWC'S PATHWAY TO LITERACY PROGRAM

- a. Designed for adults with beginner literacy skills (6 years or less of formal education)
- b. Comes at a cost
- c. Class size around 20

d. Class session length can vary

## 4. NIF'S ENGLISH AT WORK PROGRAM

- a. Comes at a cost but they will search for applicable grants
- b. Have tailored curriculums for certain industries
- c. Provided in 10-12 week sessions, 2-2.5 hrs/wk

# I. ADULT EDUCATION PROVIDER

- a. An Adult Ed Provider sets up an on-site English class at your workplace
- b. Essentially free to the employer
  - i. Funded by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development (DWD)
  - ii. Use their standardized test
  - iii. **Note**: Many Adult Ed providers have a wait time to start a class of 6 12 months.
  - iv. They look for employers with the most ability to provide incentives, such as: offering class on-site, paying employees to attend or offering a raise after completing course, providing access to computers, etc.
- c. Best for larger class sizes, up to 25/30
- d. Provide classes in ~12 week sessions, w/ 2 classes per week of 2 3 hours

#### 2. LOCAL PRIVATE LANGUAGE COMPANY

- f. Best for smaller class sizes: around 6, 8 or 12 in one class
- g. Generally offer: 30 hour class sessions (~12 week sessions, 2.5 hrs/wk)
  - i. Can vary by company, but is generally ~ \$180/hr (up to 12 students)
    - 1. Or less for smaller class size (\$130/hr for 6 students)
  - ii. Can do classes at your location, their location, or over Zoom
  - iii. Expect between \$75-\$150/hour for teacher cost

#### h. Best for very customized classes

i. Can create a curriculum and assessments based on the specific workplace language needs or start with their ready-made curriculum.

#### 3. IWC'S PATHWAY TO LITERACY PROGRAM

- j. Created for adult immigrants with 6 years or less of formal schooling
  - i. i.e. those who haven't learned to read in their own language, had limited or interrupted education
  - ii. Each student is tested for eligibility. Class only includes students at this level.
- k. Classes typically provided in 15 wk sessions, w/ 2 classes per wk of 2 hrs each
  - i. In-person classes up to ~25 students, Remote up to 20.
  - ii. Expect between \$60/hour for teacher & assistant cost
  - iii. Class are provided onsite at employer's location, or a central location for multiple employers

#### 4. NIF'S ENGLISH AT WORK PROGRAM

I. Designed for employees in the following industries:

Food Service, Facilities Management, Hospitality, Retail, Manufacturing, Ridesharing, Amusement Parks, Agriculture

- m. Innovative Teaching Design, using tailored and proven-effective curriculums
  - i. 40% of class is in-person; taught by local community college instructors
  - ii. 60% online learning through a custom-designed app
- n. Typically offered in 10 15 wk sessions, w/ 2 or 2.5 hrs of class per week
  - i. Or live class can be taught remotely, w/ students joining on computers from their various workplaces or homes
  - ii. In-person class size 25 30, Remote 20. Need minimum of 15.
  - iii. Expect costs similar to private language company
    - 1. They could provide class free for any Afghan students due to a national funding opportunity
  - iv. Would only need ~60 days to start up a new class
